Sugar Kisses is an All-Natural, Wheat-Free pastry shop. They use the freshest ingredients available and as much organic fare as possible. They offer a wide range of dietary alternatives including but not limited to Gluten-Free & Vegan baked goods. They also offer baking done with natural sugars like honey, maple syrup & brown rice syrup. The following is an excellent review of the bakery:

Finally, a bakery that's both delicious and good for you. After working in the pastry kitchen of the super posh Whitney, Lisa Turkawski decided to open up her own bakery May 1, 2003. She did not, however, have designs on custard-filled this, or glaze-coated that. "We just wanted to offer real food for real people, made from scratch," she said. "A lot of bakeries use premade stuff and that just loses the concept of what a real bakery is." Turkawski and co-owner Brian Hack are definitely keeping it real -- real delicious and really good for you. Located in what has been a long line of short-lived takeout Italian places (right next to the Royal Oak Lanes), Sugar Kisses provides sweet, breakfast food, scones, muffins, rolls and more. And while you can still get a decadent cheesecake there, they also make many of their treats vegan-friendly. Using nonrefined sugar (although it's not in everything on the menu, so you might want to ask) and organic flour, Sugar Kisses makes spelt brownies and uses rice flour in a lot of cakes and cookies. They avoid artificial coloring, dye, additives or preservatives. And everything inside the cozy confines is homemade. That alone adds its only very unique flavor to it. And in keeping with what must be an unwritten code among downtown Royal Oak retailers and their employees, Turkawski and
